During the obstetrical rotations, first year residents perform uncomplicated deliveries and primary cesarean sections. Residents learn obstetrical ultrasound and manage OB clinic visits. The residents spend-time learning benign gynecology and perform minor surgeries, including abdominal and laparoscopic tubal ligation, diagnostic laparoscopy and hysteroscopy, and dilatation and curettage. They also assist with major surgeries and operative laparoscopy. Gynecology residents staff colposcopy clinic and establish their continuity clinic, which will be continued throughout their residency training. The residents also work with acute care in the ICU. Two months of night float round out the first year.

The second postgraduate year includes more advanced obstetrics and gynecology rotations, and spend time managing the Maternal Fetal Medicine service and taking care of high-risk obstetrical patients. Operative vaginal delivery and repeat cesarean sections are learned. The PGY 2s are introduced to reproductive endocrinology. As basic surgical skills are mastered, they progress to more advanced laparoscopic surgery and abdominal hysterectomy. One full rotation is dedicated to research so that the resident can prepare their work for submission and/or presentation.

Third-year rotations include obstetrics, gynecology, urogynecology and gynecological oncology. The 4-week elective rotation allows a resident to focus on a particular area of interest. This year includes an emphasis on gynecological surgery at several Aurora institutions, as well as the transition from junior to senior resident.

The PGY-III resident can expect to perform the full range of major and minor gynecologic surgeries including vaginal surgeries and oncology surgeries. Obstetrical experience includes twin deliveries with breech extraction, advanced operative delivery, and advanced laceration repair. PGY-III residents also are supported in the management of obstetrical and gynecologic services thereby developing leadership skills and learning to serve as a consultant to our midwifery colleagues.

The fourth postgraduate year consists of time as chief resident for the gynecology and obstetrics services. Fourth year residents advance their surgical technique with both benign and oncological gynecology, and urogynecology. Chief residents prepare for the written boards and serve as teachers to junior residents. Fourth years residents master their surgical and ambulatory clinical skills while gaining confidence in their ability to manage difficult cases and acting as consultants to other health care

providers. They also have a block where they can manage their clinic as an attending in preparation for graduation and entering the workforce.

\*\* The clinic rotation differs slightly from year to year, and there are opportunities to provide care to patients in family planning, continuity clinic, research, education, breast health, OB clinic, Gyn consult and an outside gynecology clinic.

Twice per year there will be a five-week rotation block.

At the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> year, residents will be eligible for certification in robotic surgeries if all criteria are met.
